Today, is the feast of St Jerome (c347-420). He was a great scriptural scholar and translated most of the Bible into Latin, in what is known as the Vulgate translation. He also wrote many commentaries on the bible, and works on several areas of theology, as well as lives of the saints and the history of the Church. His knowledge was so wide ranging that St Augustine said of him that 'what Jerome is ignorant of, no mortal has ever known'. However, he was also well known for his bad temper and the sarcastic letters he wrote!

Psalm 89: 8-18

O LORD God of hosts, who is as mighty as you, O LORD? Your faithfulness surrounds you. You rule the raging of the sea; when its waves rise, you still them. You crushed Rahab like a carcass; you scattered your enemies with your mighty arm. The heavens are yours, the earth also is yours; the world and all that is in it—you have founded them. The north and the southe-you created them; Tabor and Hermon joyously praise your name. You have a mighty arm; strong is your hand, high your right hand. Righteousness and justice are the foundation of your throne; steadfast love and faithfulness go before you. Happy are the people who know the festal shout, who walk, O LORD, in the light of your countenance; they exult in your name all day long, and extol your righteousness. For you are the glory of their strength; by your favour our horn is exalted. For our shield belongs to the LORD, our king to the Holy One of Israel. *****
